Melbourne's 2020 population is now estimated at 4,967,733. The city has attracted waves of immigrants over the years and, as well as a large (around 150,000) British community, there are

more than 50,000 people in Melbourne who were born in each of the following countries: China, Greece, India, Italy, New Zealand and Vietnam.

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**Do the people you are working with have access to affordable education?**

Yes, there are a few available in the area that they can access.
